

Restored to Community

On the surface, our preparation for the season of Lent, which begins on Wednesday, seems straight-forward and



simple. We schedule a myriad of things to help people enter into the renewing, reconciling and transforming experience of this great, yearly journey to the heart of the mysteries of our faith. All of these events, opportunities and resources need to be announced, and this is where things get more complicated. In fact, the announcing of these events has brought me close to nervous collapse. We publish the bulletin to help you participate in the life of the community, and to assist you in growing in your participation in the mission and ministry of Christ. The problem is that as the number of things we announce increases, so does the chance of making confusing mistakes. Confused people tend to become angry and critical, and they will let me know that they are upset. So, we have been checking and re-checking maddening details all week. I have to be reminded this is all in

service to our life in Christ, and to strengthen our bonds in faith, hope and love.

This week's first reading has always seemed somewhat archaic and out-of-step with my own experience, and then two things came into my life, COVID-19 and cancer. The Israelite community's attention to the minute details of this disease was an echo of my own attention to the way that the Coronavirus was spread from person to person, and to my recognition that my immunocompromised position leaves me vulnerable. The necessity for separation from each other to reduce the spread of disease suddenly was and is my daily reality. We took a step back from each other during the COVID-19 years, and we limited our contacts to protect each other. During my cancer journey, I step back from large groups to try to keep from getting infections and viruses. Like the Israelites, we were and I am trying to accomplish two things. Out of charity, we limited contact with each other to protect each other from the harm of this disease, and we did this so that we could return to full participation in our communal life. Our actions protected the integrity and health of the community, and they established a road back to communal life. However, the separation from contact with you is an ache in my heart and an emptiness in my soul.

Jesus' response to the fear, separation, isolation and alienation of illness is to restore health, but more importantly, to restore the sick person to communal life. In the dialog between Jesus and the leper there is an important moment that can sometimes escape our notice. The leper tells Jesus if He wishes to heal him, He can. Jesus responds, "I do will it." Those four words are Jesus' response to the suffering and isolation of the leper and of all who have been separated from the life of the people of God. Jesus wills, desires, wants and acts to restore him to communal life. We too are called to work to strengthen the bonds of community, to heal the divisions among us and to strive to maintain the life of God's holy people. It is only when we enter into this great healing and hopeful mission, that the true challenge of our present struggles are met. It is in hope of healing that we do what we do. Like Jesus, we must will to do what is necessary to be restored and gathered together. Let us ask for the grace and the courage to continue our struggle in hope.




