

Covenants, Promises, and Temptation

My Lenten resolutions are not much different from the ones I make every Lent. I hope to fast throughout the whole season of Lent, with the exception of Sundays, with nothing to eat between meals. However, I will



have to eat three times a day, not just once a day as in the past, because of some concerns about how cancer is affecting my nutrition. I am planning to abstain from meat two days a week. I am imposing strict limits on my television habits by not watching T.V. after 8:00 p.m. on work nights, and I am dedicated to reading one book by Pope Francis and another on Jesus' parables. I am hoping that these promises will lead me closer to what the Lord calls me to be, lead to repentance for my sins, and allow me to accompany Jesus as he enters into his passion, death and resurrection. I started my journey to the Paschal Mystery armed with these resolutions

and the celebration of three Masses, two in English and one in Spanish. When I returned to my office after my first Mass, I was speaking to someone and noticed there were homemade caramels on my desk. I picked one up, unwrapped it and was contentedly munching on it before a voice from within me called out, "Put the caramel down. It's Ash Wednesday and you are fasting." Thus, my Lenten journey began with some good intentions, a first temptation and a failure of attention.

Our readings today ask us to consider God's promises and the reality of temptation. In our reading from the Book of Genesis, God places the rainbow in the sky as a sign of His covenant of love and protection with us. It serves as a reminder to God Himself and to us, His people, of His life-giving promises. St. Paul points out to us that the Great Flood was a foreshadowing of the renewal of creation in the waters of Baptism. We who have died with Christ now live through Him, and are sustained in blessing and goodness through His sacrifice. We have been reborn as children of God and disciples of Christ.

St. Mark's account of the temptation of Christ is the shortest in the Gospels, and perhaps the most startling. The Holy Spirit drives Jesus into the desert to confront the reality of evil. He is tested by Satan and challenged by the harshness of nature, "he was among wild beasts." His forty-day confrontation with evil, hardship and temptation are not passed without support, but He is supported by goodness and grace, "angels ministered to him." Having conquered temptation, Jesus emerges from the desert proclaiming that the time of salvation is at hand. He invites us to repent and to have faith in the Gospel, the good news, he proclaims. Knowing His enemy and fully understanding the hope He is and will be, Jesus begins to call the world to new life.

I encourage all of you to find some way to pray, fast and give alms this Lenten season as a way of renewing the life-giving covenant of your Baptism. These Lenten disciplines are a call to remember God's covenant of love with us, to be strengthened in our promises by the promises of Christ, and a time for us to support each other when we are tempted to abandon our path to the resurrection of the Lord. There will be temptations and discouragement along the way. Just say to yourself, "Put the candy down, it's Lent."
