

We Want to See Jesus

Today's Gospel begins with the request, "Sir we would like to see Jesus." Pilgrims in Jerusalem for the Passover Feast long for an encounter with the Lord. They want to come into his presence, be touched by his power and to contemplate the mystery being revealed in his presence among them. Jesus takes this opportunity to invite His disciples to see His coming passion and crucifixion as the love of God lifted up for all to see. Jesus reminds us that dying to ourselves and abandoning ourselves completely to God is the path to eternal life. While He suffers anguish as He contemplates His passion, Jesus embraces His mission with love and certitude. He does not turn his face away from his coming passion, but, even in anguish, embraces his mission.



These days I am consumed with the longing of these pilgrims. I long to contemplate the Lord, to gaze upon his loving face, to be embraced by his courage and faith in God's plan, and to be reassured that it is in the

complete abandonment of ourselves to the power and love of our all gracious Father that we will be brought to life. I long to know the power of God reaching into the desolation of suffering and death and bringing the promise and light of new and invincible life. As my health slowly deteriorates, I try to embrace the invitation to die to myself, and to live only the life of Christ within me.

As we enter the final weeks of our Lenten journey, we are called to die to ourselves. As we seek to come into the presence of the Lord, we are asked to die to our sinfulness and pride, to be embraced by God's merciful compassion and to bear the fruit of life rooted in the Lord. It is only when we can surrender our desires, plans, will and thought to God's hopes and dreams for our lives that we will come to new and abundant life.

The celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a crucial part of our preparation to enter into the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord. Our penitence and discipline have been helping us to see our need for God and to hear our very selves cry out for His presence. We seek God's mercy and forgiveness so that we might come into His presence and be wrapped in His love and joy. We seek to give up our lives that Christ might live in us.

The journey of Lent is quickly drawing to a close and we are longing for the joy of forgiveness and new life. We must die to our old selves in order to live for the Lord. We have spent long days and weeks examining our lives, disciplining our wills and creating a space for the Lord in our hearts. The celebrations of the Sacrament of Reconciliation throughout this holy season represent our dying to ourselves so that we might be reborn in the love of God. Our gathering to seek God's forgiveness is a proclamation of our hope in the mercy and compassion of the Lord who is lifted up on the cross to embrace us in His wonderful mercy. We ask, along with the whole Church, to see the Lord, and surprisingly enough in the celebrations of this holy season we are privileged to come into His presence.

The season of Lent is a time to seek the Lord's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In addition to our regular Reconciliation times, we will be having a Communal Celebration of the Sacrament at 10:30 a.m. on Thursday, **March 21** at Holy Redeemer Church.






