

A Restless Sharing of the Gospel

This spring has been a restless and anxious time for me. After being closed up inside all winter we are ready to be outside, to enjoy the warmer and longer days, and to soak up the sunlight that has been so scarce since



last October. We want to shed layers of clothes and shake off the doldrums of the black, white and gray of winter. We are caught up in a restlessness that invades our work days, and makes our night less restful. Something inside of us wants to get up, move, change and break free of what has closed us in. By the time you read this, I will have been confined to bed and unable to walk for the first time since I have been here. First Communion celebrations will go on without me. I will know how many days there are until the end of the school year and to the various celebrations that mark the end of our year. But, I will not be a part of them. My great restlessness and anticipation is orientated to my coming union with the Lord through death. I am sad

that this will be the last time that I will address you, but as I promised, you are in my prayer and thoughts each day. I dedicate the energy I have to the goodness and mercy in your lives and pray that God will hold you, protect you and keep you in his loving embrace.

Easter should be a restless and anxious time. The good news of Jesus' victory over sin and death has invaded our souls, and we feel a need to share the news with others. In our first readings each week we hear how the Gospel is spreading. Uncertainty and doubt are fading, and the Gospel is beginning to reach out. Not even persecution can quiet the loud shout of the Gospel, but rather it becomes the reason to bring the message of Jesus to new people and places. In his letters, St. John proclaims the overwhelming love that the resurrection of Jesus has freed in our midst. Darkness and fear have no room in hearts filled with the joy of the resurrection. Our Gospel today reminds us that just as a vine gives life to all its branches, so our connection to Jesus becomes new life surging through our very beings.

The fruit of our faith in the resurrection is a restless proclamation of the joy of faith in the power of Jesus over sin and death. We move from celebration to celebration bathed in the light of a new creation established by God himself. The obstacles and struggles that come our way daily are challenges to find new ways to proclaim the Gospel.

Jesus tells us today that God is glorified in our bearing much fruit and becoming Jesus' disciples. Let us become true disciples, true followers and students of the Lord, and proclaim with joy and confidence that the Lord is risen and we are still celebrating.


